










NDSCCC — Member Contribution Graham & Polly Hawkes



We were Invited to take our 1971 Morris Traveller to Haynes Motor Museum on the 7th of September to the inaugural classic car show to celebrate the life of the late John Haynes and the 40th anniversary of him opening the Museum in Somerset. The showground was packed with vehicles from the 1930s right up to fairly modern

Above is a display of Morris Minors that came off the production line but were a bit different from the normal Morris 1000s being made.

To the left is one of the very first lowlight split windscreen Morris's and one of the very last; it being our Traveller which they wanted mainly because of the colour which is "Limeflower". Very few were ever made in this colour, used only in the last ten months of production.

Next was a Minor Million it being one of only 350 ever made to celebrate the manufacturer of one million Morris Minor's. These were all painted Lilac with white upholstery and 320 of them were distributed to the Morris dealerships in the U.K. The remaining 30 went to dealerships abroad.

The next was a G.P.O. van, although quite a common sight on the roads at one time most of them were run into the ground so this is a rare sight to see one complete with ladders and all the equipment inside.

Finally there is a pickup which is still a great little workhorse for a roofing contractor.

The showground looks a little empty but I waiting until nearly everyone had left to get a photo without crowds of people blocking the line up. It was a marvellous show very enjoyable.

Tim sent this discussion piece for your perusal

At the age of 79 I like to think my driving technique is pretty well sorted. However, every day is a school day at the wheel and one should always be open to learn. I must confess that for many years, when approaching road works on a dual carriageway or motorway when signals warned of one or more lanes closed ahead I would take the open lane early and be happy to join a line of slow moving or stationary traffic while the other lanes might remain nearly empty. I used to think of overtaking drivers as selfish 'queue jumpers' and even welcomed the practice of some HGV drivers who would stop in an open lane some way short of the restriction to prevent just this sort of overtaking. I now recognise that this is a silly and potentially dangerous practice and am now convinced that I was wrong and the best approach is to merge in turn as recommended in Rule 134 of the Highway Code. You should drive right up to the line of cones used to close a lane and then merge in 'zip' mode. In this way all vehicles will stay in their lane right up to the lane closure. Any tailback is kept to a minimum since slow moving and stationary vehicles are spread over all available lanes right up to the lane closure(s). A reduction in the difference in speeds between the lanes, without the urgency to move over, makes the merge easier and safer. The length of a queue is reduced by up to 50% and, when nobody has a perceived advantage, the potential for 'road rage' is reduced significantly. It is noticeable that the road signs 'When Queueing Use Both Lanes' and 'Merge in Turn' are becoming more widespread. It is to be hoped that with time this practice will become universal with its advantages widely recognised.






