




NDSCCC Member Contribution Kevin Burridge—Total A-Mas-ement

Recently we had this ever so lovely Maserati Merak limp into our yard feeling sounding very sickly indeed. Its deep black paintwork and pointy Italdesign lines being let down by it's coughing and spluttering (now 3 cylinder) engine. On first inspection with it running, it was soon established that the right bank of cylinders weren't firing, and as the car runs 2 separate coils, a quick swap over with leads showed us that indeed the coil pack had failed. For the low cost of coils, we replaced both and left the remaining good one in the car. Whilst I was doing the basic checks I found that some plugs were far cleaner than others, indicting that the carbs were far out of balance. I had the very inconvenient job of removing the airbox, which was not as straightforward as you'd hope due to the less than convenient design of welding the studs to the base plate of the airbox. The airbox lid studs (Which are welded to the base plate may I add) being 2 inches in height, with only 1 ½ space to the bottom of the Bulkead. Meaning I had to lift the airbox up with one hand, and undo the mounting nuts through the gap with the other, before pulling everything backwards to gain access to the tops of the carbs. The Maserati has a compact little V6 with 3 sets of Weber DCNFs, all sharing one throttle linkage bar. First I adjusted the locknuts to match the positions of the butterflys so all the carbs opened at the same time, which already made a big difference to the airflow through the carbs, and later Kevin adjusted the mixture individually to bring the hydrocarbons to a good level. He uses the gas analyzer and his vast knowledge to find the right balance. A lot of folk focus too much on bringing the CO levels to a point where they are nearly matching a modern car, figures as low as 1.5 or 2% CO, (a modern petrol car is 0.2%). But the truth is that due to the poor quality of modern petrol compared to the petrol that was around when these engines were new, and also the "antiquated" designs of inlet manifolds and cylinder heads, it is impossible to get the older cars running nicely with the "correct" air fuel ratio. The extra fuel serves a purpose of preventing fuel evaporation in the manifold or carbs. We find with many classics we end up with a CO rating of nearly 6% in some cases to get the engine sounding its sweetest, relying more on the hydrocarbon figures to determine the right tune of the vehicle. If you check our Instagram page you can see videos before and after we balanced the carbs.

Once we had got the engine tuned and running smoothly again, all that was left to do was refit the suspension arms, as Kevin eagle-eye noticed the rear wishbones had been fitted back to front meaning every time the suspension compressed, the reinforcement sections whacked the exhaust manifolds and dented them, as well as the driveshaft bolts being loose, so also dealt with those while we were in there. Once all done, gave it a light wash off and returned to the customer who was very happy with how the pointy girl was driving again. A nice successful turnaround.






